(Montgomery County Delegation)

Montgomery County - Beer and Wine Licenses - Shochu and Soju MC 20-18

This proposed bill expressly authorizes the sale of shochu and soju by a licensee in Montgomery County if his or her license authorizes the sale of wine. The shochu and soju may be sold under the same terms and conditions that apply to the sale of wine. The bill also excludes shochu and soju from an existing prohibition against selling alcoholic beverages under a beer and wine license in Montgomery County if the beverages contain more than 22% alcohol by volume. Instead, shochu and soju may be sold if it contains up to 24% alcohol by volume.

The bill takes effect July 1, 2018.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: The bill does not directly affect State operations or finances.

Local Effect: The bill does not materially affect Montgomery County operations or finances.

Small Business Effect: Minimal.

Analysis

Bill Summary: The bill defines “shochu” as a Japanese alcoholic beverage that contains up to 24% alcohol by volume and is derived from agricultural products. “Soju” is defined as a Korean alcoholic beverage that contains up to 24% alcohol by volume and is derived from agricultural products. Therefore, under the bill, the holder of a beer and wine license in Montgomery County may sell shochu and soju that is up to 24% alcohol by volume.

Current Law/Background: In Montgomery County, an alcoholic beverages licensee can only sell wine if he or she obtains a (1) beer and wine license or (2) beer, wine, and liquor license. The holder of a beer and wine license may only sell alcoholic beverages that contain up to 22% alcohol by volume. The prohibition includes naturally fermented or fortified wine. Due to this prohibition, the holder of a beer and wine license in the county cannot currently sell shochu and soju that is over 22% alcohol by volume. There are 441 beer and wine licenses issued for use in the county.

Shochu is a common type of distilled alcoholic beverage traditionally produced in Japan. It is often distilled from rice, barley, sweet potatoes, buckwheat, or brown sugar and may contain other ingredients such as chestnut, sesame seeds, and carrots. Soju is a common type of distilled alcoholic beverage traditionally produced in South Korea. It is often distilled from rice, wheat, barley, potatoes, sweet potatoes, or tapioca.
